THEY WENT AND SAW

Dear Fellow Disciples, peace.

We are starting again at ordinary time and right away, we are in front of an invitation from Jesus, "Come and See". The disciples of John went and saw where Jesus lived and what kind of rabbi he was. They stayed with Him. What did they see? Or what did they want to see? Was it just curiosity on their part? For the master Jesus was a pilgrim, with no housing nor

The object of the disciples' vision was the identity of Jesus. They saw who he was. They recognized his identity as the Messiah. So much so that when leaving they announced Him as the Christ and worked so that others would encounter Him as well.

Their vision of Jesus wasn't limited to a human, physical vision that detects details of places and circumstances. It was rather a spiritual vision permitting them to go beyond the empirical appearances to encounter and recognize Jesus.

Today those who want to follow Jesus in discipleship will need to follow the same partner of the journey of the first disciples. Discipleship will not be possible if we don't "come and see", recognize and commit to Jesus' identity. Otherwise, it will be a fake or false discipleship. For we are supposed to know Him first to avoid inconsistency and error.

Discipleship today passes but is not limited to, through prayer, the Sacraments, Bible and Catechism study, as well as knowledge of the Church's teaching from the

PATHWAY TO PROGRESS

Since our last update in early December, progress on the Saint Rose Development has been ongoing, albeit not as robust as anticipated due to the holiday season. Nevertheless, we have made sufficient strides to forecast a busy January ahead.

In relation to the Marian Center, the structural engineer from Bauer Askew has conducted a comprehensive inspection, resulting in a forthcoming report detailing his findings. Overall, the building's structure is in good condition; however, they identified issues that may impact the optimal utilization of the space. A meeting with the architects is scheduled for mid-January to explore available options. We will provide a comprehensive update on our recommendations following that discussion.

Concerning the Athletic Field Relocation, we have secured legal approval from the Diocese, and approval for parish fund allocation is expected in the coming days. Once received, we will initiate the project promptly.

In the context of the Master Plan update, the December 19th meeting with the ONE Building Committee had to be postponed. However, we have rescheduled it for January 8th. During this meeting, Bill Heyer will present his final recommendations for development. Following this session, I intend to conduct multiple presentations for the parish, explaining our proposed actions, rationale, associated costs, and timelines.

Finally, continued progress is being made regarding the use of the 30 acres to the North. Will Moorehead has already undertaken bushhogging on some existing trails, enhancing accessibility. We eagerly await word from the USDA regarding our application for EPIC funds to clear the underbrush next summer. If you are interested in actively contributing to this project, please reach out to Leslee Dodd Karl at ldoddkarl@saintrose.org; she would appreciate hearing from you.

Desde nuestra última actualización a principios de diciembre, el progreso en el Desarrollo de Saint Rose ha continuado, aunque no tan sólido como se anticipó debido a la temporada Navideña. Sin embargo, hemos avanzado lo suficiente como para pronosticar un enero ajetreado.

En relación con el Marian Center (Centro Mariano), el ingeniero estructural de Bauer Askew ha realizado una inspección exhaustiva, de la que se publicará un informe detallado de sus conclusiones. En general, la estructura del edificio se encuentra en buenas condiciones; sin embargo, identificaron problemas que pueden afectar la utilización óptima del espacio. Está prevista una reunión con los arquitectos para mediados de enero para explorar las opciones disponibles. Proporcionaremos una actualización completa sobre nuestras recomendaciones después de esa discusión.

Con respecto a la reubicación del campo deportivo, hemos obtenido la aprobación legal de la Diócesis y se espera la aprobación para la asignación de fondos parroquiales en los próximos días. Una vez recibido, iniciaremos el proyecto de inmediato.

En el contexto de la actualización del Plan Maestro, la reunión del 19 de diciembre con el Comité de Construcción de ONE tuvo que posponerse. Sin embargo, lo hemos reprogramado para el 8 de enero. Durante esta reunión, Bill Heyer presentará sus recomendaciones finales para el desarrollo. Después de esta sesión, tengo la intención de realizar múltiples presentaciones para la parroquia, explicando nuestras acciones propuestas, fundamentos, costos asociados y cronogramas.

Finalmente, se están logrando avances continuos con respecto al uso de los 30 acres al norte. Will Moorehead ya ha realizado trabajos de limpieza en algunos senderos existentes, mejorando la accesibilidad. Esperamos ansiosamente noticias del USDA sobre nuestra solicitud de fondos EPIC para limpiar la maleza el próximo verano.
