BETWEEN LIGHT AND DARKNESS (Laetare Sunday)

Dear Fellow Disciples, peace.

Nicodemus' visit at night allows Jesus to address a theme not only important to the disciples but to humanity. The predisposition we have to let ourselves be involved with darkness, even though the light is offered to us. Nobody is free from such risk.

Jesus is the Light the Father offers humanity. His witness of love, even to the extreme of his total surrender was enough to touch people's hearts. Was it? Many decided to tread the path of selfishness and favor injustice and evil with no regard for those who suffer.

From the beginning of our Capital Campaign, we have strived to provide transparency. Our Finance Committee has advised on financial matters and the Parish Council has prioritized our initiatives. Together, we have ensured that all decisions have addressed the parish's needs, reflected our mission and served our community effectively.

As we further navigate the financial aspects of this campaign, I want to reiterate some important information I shared in the bulletin last October – our original goal, though carefully calculated, was based on cost estimates from 2020 when we initially completed the Master Plan. Our continued research and discussions with architects have proven our assumption that **we will need a significant increase in participation and funds to finish phases I and II.**

Here's why we need to raise more money:

Expenses: Our strategic plan is ambitious and requires substantial financial resources. We need to consider factors such as updated construction costs and operational expenses to complete our initiatives.

Growing Community: Our parish is flourishing! Our ministries are reaching more people than ever. To sustain this growth, we need additional resources and space.

Stewardship: As stewards of God's gifts, we have a responsibility to ensure the long-term health of our parish. By addressing financial needs transparently, we honor our commitment to each other and to God.

Feeling like it's too difficult to do this by ourselves is okay. It's often exactly where God wants us – because it pushes us to rely on Him. As you lift the cross Jesus asks of you this Lent, please remember our Capital Campaign. We are counting on each other and counting on God! He will walk in the desert with us.

What Can You Do?

Pray: Lift our parish in prayer. Seek God's guidance as we work together.

Give: If you're able, please pledge or consider increasing your pledge. Every little bit helps.

Engage: Attend parish meetings, volunteer your time to help with the campaign in any capacity, ask questions, and stay informed. Your involvement matters.

Remember, we are a family – a community bound by faith. Let's face these challenges together, trusting that God's grace will guide us. Thank you for your continued support and dedication.

Desde el comienzo de nuestra Campaña Capital, nos hemos esforzado por brindar transparencia. Nuestro Comité de Finanzas nos ha asesorado en temas financieros y el Consejo Parroquial ha priorizado nuestras iniciativas. He aquí por qué necesitamos recaudar más dinero:

Gastos: Nuestro plan estratégico es ambicioso y requiere recursos financieros sustanciales. Necesitamos considerar factores como los costos de construcción actualizados y los gastos operativos para completar nuestras iniciativas.

Comunidad en crecimiento: ¡Nuestra parroquia está floreciendo! Nuestros ministerios están llegando a más personas que nunca. Para sostener este crecimiento, necesitamos recursos y espacio adicionales.

Administración: Como administradores de los dones de Dios, tenemos la responsabilidad de garantizar la salud a largo plazo de nuestra parroquia. Al abordar las necesidades financieras de manera transparente, honramos nuestro compromiso mutuo y con Dios.
