PATHWAY TO PROGRESS

In our last update in January of this year, we stated that the Feasibility Study for the Marian Center Renovation was well underway. We had received approval from the Diocese legal team to enter into a contract on the Athletic Field Relocation Study and were planning to meet with the Saint Rose ONE

Building Committee to present the preferred alternative for the Master Plan Update. We also reported that we had completed some clearing on the 30-acre Nature Sanctuary and finalized a federal grant request for EPIC funds to clear out the underbrush on this property.

Since then, we have finished the Feasibility Study for the Marian Center. The results of that study indicate that while it is cheaper on a square foot basis to renovate the building than it would be to build a new one, once we bring the building up to current standards it would cost more than a more efficiently laid out new facility. We presented this information to the Parish Council, the Finance Committee, and the College of Consultors at the Diocese; all concurred with a new center. The next steps will be to complete the design and get bids for construction. We will then once again present the information to the Parish Council, Finance Committee, and Diocesan College of Consultors for approval to move ahead.

Regarding the athletic field relocation, we have started the fieldwork to identify key tree locations as well as conduct wetland and geotechnical investigations. This information is needed to develop the athletic field master plan and cost estimates. We hope to present these findings to the parish and Diocese in June.

Regarding the Masterplan Update, we have been making presentations throughout the last two months. At this writing, we have presented 11 times to both English and Spanish-speaking audiences. Hopefully, you took the opportunity to sit in on one of those presentations. If you missed it and would like to hear it, let Karin Gleason know and we can set a time to present. The PowerPoint presentation is posted on the website.

The cash balance in the Capital Campaign fund is growing. Our current balance is around \$1.4M. That is more than enough to do the new building. We intend to complete the new building and athletic field relocation without borrowing money. We will need around \$3.5M to complete these two projects. As soon as these projects are going, we would like to start the design of the new gym.

Please join me and others in the \$100 a Month Club! We're thankful for the facilities we have that were built by past generations. It's important to recognize that many of those individuals are still alive, and their contributions continue to enrich our lives. Now it's our turn to build for future generations!



En nuestra última actualización en enero de este año, declaramos que el Estudio de Viabilidad para la Renovación del Centro Mariano estaba en marcha, que habíamos recibido la aprobación del equipo legal de la Diócesis para entrar en un contrato sobre el Estudio de Reubicación del Campo Atlético y que estábamos planeando reunirnos con el Comité de Construcción de Santa Rosa (ONE Building Committee) para presentar la alternativa preferida de la Actualización del Plan Maestro.

También informamos que habíamos completado una limpieza en el Santuario de la Naturaleza de 30 acres y finalizado una solicitud de subvención federal para fondos EPIC para limpiar la maleza en esta propiedad.

Desde entonces hemos finalizado el Estudio de Viabilidad del Centro Mariano. Los resultados de ese estudio indican que, si bien es más barato, por metro cuadrado, renovar el edificio que construir uno nuevo, una vez que lo llevemos a los estándares actuales costaría más que un nuevo diseño más eficiente de la instalación. Presentamos esta información al Consejo Parroquial, al Comité de Finanzas y al Colegio de Consultores de la Diócesis y todos estuvieron de acuerdo con un nuevo Centro. Los próximos pasos serán completar el diseño y conseguir ofertas para la construcción. Luego, una vez más presentaremos la información al Consejo Parroquial, al Comité de Finanzas y al Colegio Diocesano de Consultores para su aprobación para seguir adelante.

Con respecto a la reubicación del campo deportivo, hemos comenzado el trabajo de campo para identificar ubicaciones clave de árboles, así como realizar investigaciones geotécnicas y de humedales. Esta información es necesaria para desarrollar el plan maestro del campo deportivo y las estimaciones de costos. Esperamos presentar estos hallazgos a la parroquia y a la Diócesis en junio.

En cuanto a la Actualización del Plan Maestro, hemos estado haciendo presentaciones a lo largo de los últimos dos meses. Al momento de escribir este artículo, nos hemos presentado once veces ante audiencias inglesas e hispanas. Espero que haya aprovechado la oportunidad para asistir a una de esas presentaciones. Si se lo perdió y le gustaría escucharlo, infórmelo a Karin Gleason y podremos fijar una hora para presentarlo. La presentación de PowerPoint está publicada en el sitio web.

El saldo de efectivo de la Campaña Capital está creciendo. Nuestro saldo actual es de alrededor de \$1,4 millones de dólares. Eso es más que suficiente para hacer el nuevo Centro. Tenemos la intención de completar la reubicación del nuevo centro y campo deportivo sin pedir dinero prestado. Necesitaremos alrededor de \$3,5 millones de dólares para completar estos dos proyectos. Tan pronto como estos proyectos estén en marcha, nos gustaría comenzar el diseño del nuevo gimnasio.

¡Únase a mí y a otros en el Club de \$100 al Mes! Estamos agradecidos por las instalaciones que tenemos y que fueron construidas por generaciones pasadas. Es importante reconocer que muchas de esas personas todavía están vivas y sus contribuciones continúan enriqueciendo nuestras vidas. ¡Ahora es nuestro turno de construir para las generaciones futuras!

HAITI UPDATE

Many of you may have heard the news of the strife which has been escalating in Haiti. At least 80% of the country's capital, Port au Prince, is currently controlled by gangs. In the past couple of weeks, they have attacked and burned multiple police stations and continue to attack key state institutions.

The city's main airport was shut down after it was raided. There are reports of disruption to the sea ports which has caused the importation of desperately needed food and other supplies to be forced to a halt. The two largest prisons in Haiti were also raided freeing more than 4,000 inmates, many of them whom are gang leaders and members.

At this point, our parish in Robillard is safe. They are located roughly 144 miles from Port au Prince. The major city in the north, Cap Haitien, is 9 miles from Robillard and is relatively quiet. There is a real risk supplies such as food and fuel will begin to deplete as they have in Port au Prince due to the instability.

We continue to keep in close contact with Fr. Doristin, and he wants all of you to know how grateful he is for your continued support and prayers. Please pray for peace and for God's light to shine down on Haiti during this difficult time. Thank you all so much.
